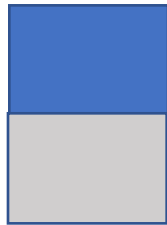
Grand Square

Materials: 5 – 5 in. squares of dark material

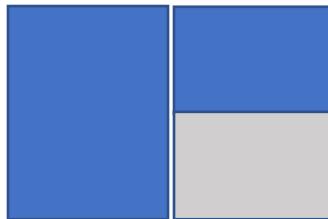
5 – 5 in. squares of light material

Sewing time: 30 minutes or less.

1. Stack 2 5 in. squares of dark material on top of the other. Both with the right sides up. Cut the stacked squares in half yielding 4 - 2 1/2 by 5 in. rectangles.
2. Cut 1 of the 5 in squares of light material and 1 of the 5 in. squares of dark material into 4 2½ by 2½ in. squares. You will have 4 light and 4 dark 4 2½ in. squares
3. Sew 1 dark 2½ in. square to 1 light 2½ in. square. Repeat 3 times to make 4 pieced units. Press seams.



4. Sew pieced units made in step 3 to dark 2½ by 5 in. rectangle made in step 1. Make 4 of these units. Press seams. These will be the corner units



5. Trim 1 of the dark 5 in. squares to 4 ½ by 4 1/2 in. square. This is the centre square in the block.
6. Lay the completed corner units and squares out in a 9 patch formation. Make sure that the light 2½ in. square in each of the

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corner units made in step 3 is orientated so that the light square is facing towards the centre.

7. Sew each row together and then sew the rows together. Press seams
8. Square block to $12\frac{1}{2}$ in. if necessary
