Woven - March 2024 - BOM 12.5" x 12.5" unfinished Colour Theory - Rectangle Tetrad Technique- Partial seams




Using your colour wheel pick your favorite colour. Mine is yellow. Place one rectangle point (it's the green rectangle on the colour wheel below) on your colour then the other three points on the rectangle will be your tetrad.



Fabric requirements:


Fabric 1 - 3.5" X 11.0" scrap. (my green) Fabric 2 - 2.0" X 10.0" scrap. (my red) Fabric 3 - 2.5" X 11.5" scrap. (my yellow) Fabric 4 - 2.5" X 11.0" scrap. (my purple) **Cutting Instructions:** Background Fabric: snow/ white A1 - 2.5" X 3.0" C3 - 1.5" X 4.5" A3 - 2.5" X 2.5" D1 - 4.5" X 4.5" B1 - 1.5" X 2.5" D3 - 4.5" X 3.0" E - 1.5" X 3.0" B3 - 4.5" X 2.5" C1 - 2.5" X 4.5" **Woven Strips Dimensions:** Fabric 1 - My green (A4/C2) Fabric 3 - My yellow (B2/D4) A4 - 3.5" X 6.5" B2 - 2.5" X 2.5" C2 - 3.5" X 4.5" D4 - 2.5" X 9.0" Fabric 2 - My red (A2/B4) Fabric 4 - My purple (C4/D2) A2 - 2.5" X 2.0" C4 - 6.5" X 2.5" B4 - 7.5" X 2.0" D2 - 4.5" X 2.5



Instructions:

Assemble A pieces together as in above diagram, then assemble B,C and D

Sew E to bottom right corner of A4 leaving $\frac{1}{4}$ " allowance at top of E piece, see pic below. Sew C4 to A block, see ic below.Press to dark.





Sew D block to new block (A, C above).

Sew B4 to D block making sure to catch the top of the E piece. Sew B and A to complete sewing. Press to dark. True block to 12.5" X 12.5
